Across sub-Saharan Africa, demand for climate-resilient urban infrastructure and services is high. Urban centres are expanding, increasing pressure to deliver services and manage growth while responding to climate impacts that disproportionately affect vulnerable groups.

Since its launch in 2015, the Covenant of Mayors in Sub-Saharan Africa (CoM SSA) has mobilised **political commitment for climate action from over 400 signatory local governments** in 42 countries, representing more than 166 million citizens.

By working with local governments to develop robust climate and energy plans, as well as **scaling impactful, finance-ready climate and urban solutions**, CoM SSA supports an African urban transformation steered by subnational actors.

CoM SSA spans the full urban project cycle. It supports evidence-based climate and energy plans, translates identified priorities into implementation pipelines, and offers cooperation formats that strengthen local capabilities and ownership.

Through the sustained support of the European Union and European co-funders and implementers, CoM SSA advances investment readiness by bringing early financial diagnostics, upstream engagement with finance actors, and participatory and gender-responsive approaches into the implementation process. CoM SSA also improves coordination across international and regional partners, helping connect local demands to wider investment and partnership opportunities.

CoM SSA has grown into a **flagship of EU-Africa cooperation**. It reflects a shared commitment by co-funders and implementers to support urban transformation through sustained engagement, European expertise and local capacities.

CoM SSA is the regional chapter of the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy (GCoM), the world's largest alliance for city climate leadership, connecting CoM SSA signatories to a global network of subnational actors and partners.

The importance of working on energy and climate change in African cities:



By 2050, **one in every four people** on Earth will **live in Africa**.



Despite **contributing just 9% to global greenhouse gas emissions**, **Africa** is the **most vulnerable** continent to **climate change impacts**—already losing up to 5% of GDP annually to climate-related shocks such as droughts, floods, and heat extremes—**yet it receives only 3% of global climate finance**.



Currently, **658 million people** in Africa still **lack access to electricity**.

How does CoM SSA support local climate action?

Climate and energy planning

CoM SSA enables local governments to develop Sustainable Energy Access and Climate Action Plans (SEACAPs), that are inclusive, data-driven, and aligned with both local and national priorities.

Project preparation and technical support

CoM SSA helps cities to identify, design and prepare bankable urban infrastructure projects, in collaboration with financial institutions and private sector partners.

Peer learning and partnerships

CoM SSA facilitates regional cooperation, city-to-city exchanges and multilevel partnerships to accelerate knowledge sharing and strengthen capacity.

CoM SSA Regional Mayors Forum

CoM SSA's Regional Mayors Forum (RMF), which consists of 12 elected African Mayors representing each sub-region of sub-Saharan Africa, amplifies the voices of African cities in global and regional forums, while strengthening regional cooperation and engagement with national governments. This political leadership fosters the enabling environment needed for local implementation and sustained climate ambition.

The RMF brings signatories' feedback, priority items, and strategic inputs to CoM SSA and GCoM decision-making bodies, including the CoM SSA Steering Committee and the GCoM Board.
